Introduction

Nunukwarrin Yunti is the largest Aboriginal community controlled health organisation in South Australia. We offer a wide range of primary health, social & emotional wellbeing, health promotion and health training & development services to Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people.

Family Partnership Program

The Family Partnership Program is a health promotion Home Visiting program for first time mums (or first time to parent) who are having an Aboriginal baby to improve their own life outcomes and those of their baby.

Program Aims

The Program aims to:

- Improve outcomes in pregnancy by improving women's pre-natal health
- Improve outcomes for child health and development by helping mothers to provide more skilled parenting; and
- Support mothers to plan for their future including completing education and / or finding work

What's involved?

- Women are visited by an Aboriginal Family Partnership Worker and Nurse Home Visitor during pregnancy from 16 weeks of age and the first 2 years after birth of the baby.

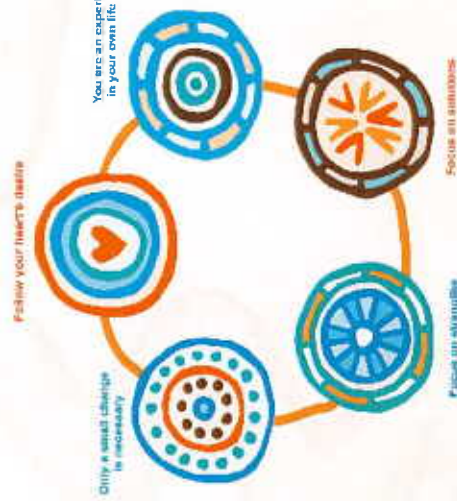
- Women are provided with information and education on staying well during pregnancy and infant and child health and development
- Opportunities to join group sessions, activities and peer support.

Program Eligibility

- First time mother (or the first opportunity to parent)
- Having an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander baby
- Less than 26 weeks pregnant
- Participating on a voluntary basis

Program Principles

We walk alongside the women and their families throughout their journey from pregnancy to parenthood following these five client-centred principles:



Program Referrals

Women or family members can ask about joining the Program by calling (08) 81505000 or emailing us at nvfp@nunuku.org.au. They can also ask their health professionals to refer them - or service providers can refer with their consent.

An Aboriginal Family Partnership Worker will then arrange to visit the women to provide more information about the program.

Referral pathways

We can assist families to access other services including:

- Strong Mums Solid Kids program
- Social Emotional Wellbeing practitioners
- Tackling Tobacco and Healthy Lifestyles
- Harm minimisation support and counselling
- GP services
- and other services such as housing, child care, Centrelink, birthing hospitals and other services that families may need
